



EASTBOUND ATLANTIC OCEAN CROSSING 20 NIGHTS - FROM ANTIGUA TO SPAIN

Sailing from St. John's, Antigua to Malaga, Spain, this transatlantic voyage combines the romance of traditional tall-ship sailing with the vast openness of the Atlantic. After departing the Caribbean's renowned yachting hub, days at sea unfold under full sail with opportunities to relax on deck, take the helm, or climb the rigging. A call in Ponta Delgada on Sao Miguel showcases historic churches and palaces shaped by centuries of maritime trade, before the crossing concludes in Malaga, where Moorish landmarks and nearby Granada's Alhambra reflect Spain's rich cultural legacy.



ITINERARY

Day 1 St. John's, Antigua

The dockyards, marinas, old inns, venerable pubs and convivial crowds of sun-tanned yacht crews; this is the epicentre of the Caribbean yachting world.

Days 2 - 13 At Sea

officers and crew.

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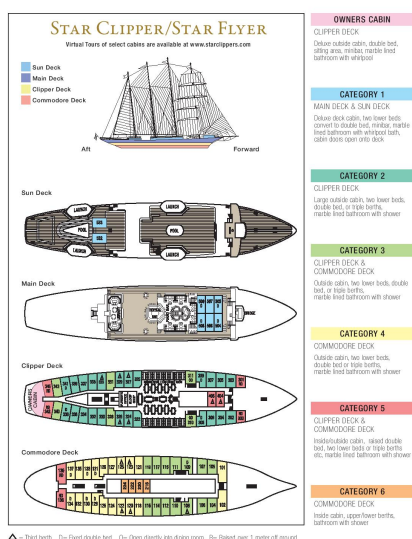
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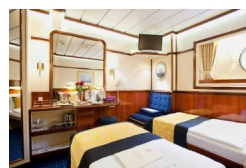
