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MALAGA TO NICE 7 NIGHTS MEDITERRANEAN CRUISE

This Royal Clipper voyage from Malaga to Nice sails the sunlit shores of southern and eastern Spain before reaching the glamour of the French Riviera. Departing historic Malaga, guests encounter Moorish masterpieces including the Alhambra near Motril, then continue to the Roman legacy of Cartagena and the medieval citadel crowning Peñíscola. The journey blends artistic brilliance in Barcelona and coastal charm in Roses before crossing into France, where the timeless allure of Saint-Tropez leads to an elegant finale in Nice.



ITINERARY

Day 1 Malaga, Spain

Malaga's fortress palace of the Alcazaba and the Castillo de Gibralfaro are splendid examples of Moorish architecture. But it is in Granada that you can see the most romantic and magnificent expression of the Arabesque style in the glorious Alhambra Palace.

Day 2 Motril, Spain

Motril, on Spain's southern coast, is a vibrant port city steeped in history, culture and Mediterranean charm. It is a popular seaside destination offering a unique combination of beautiful



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beaches, historic monuments and culinary delights. Motril is an excellent base for exploring the city of Granada, the villages of the Alpujarras or the rum distillery and tropical fruit plantation.

Day 3 Cartagena, Spain

Cartagena, a historic port city steeped in rich history and fascinating culture. Nestling between the hills and the Mediterranean Sea, the city offers an enchanting mix of historic sites, including the Roman Theatre, picturesque beaches and a lively atmosphere.

Day 4 Peniscola, Spain

Rising dramatically from the sea, Peñíscola is one of Spain's most striking coastal towns - a whitewashed maze of cobbled streets crowned by a medieval castle. Passengers can wander through the old quarter, where balconies overflow with flowers and the scent of the sea drifts through narrow alleys, or climb to the Castle of Papa Luna, once home to an exiled pope. Below, golden beaches stretch for miles, lined with cafes and terraces overlooking the bay. Whether exploring history or relaxing in the sun, Peñíscola offers a perfect balance of Spanish charm, coastal beauty, and timeless tranquility.

Day 5 Barcelona, Spain

Vibrant, artistic, and endlessly captivating, Barcelona is a city that awakens every sense. Passengers can wander through the narrow streets of the Gothic Quarter, where history whispers from

every stone, or marvel at Gaudi's architectural masterpieces - from the soaring Sagrada Familia to the whimsical curves of Park Guell. Along the elegant boulevards and lively waterfront, cafes and tapas bars invite moments of indulgence beneath the Mediterranean sun. Whether exploring world-class museums, strolling the famous Las Ramblas, or simply watching the city's rhythm unfold, Barcelona offers a unique blend of culture, creativity, and coastal charm.

Day 6 Roses, Spain

Sheltered by the beautiful Gulf of Roses on Spain's Costa Brava, Roses combines seaside charm with rich cultural heritage. Passengers can stroll along the palm-lined promenade, where restaurants offer the chance to taste Catalan specialties, explore the impressive Citadel and the picturesque ruins of the old village, relax on one of the town's golden beaches, or explore the Cap de Creus promontory that stretches just behind the town. For those wishing to venture further, optional excursions (available at an additional cost) visit two remarkable sites: the hilltop Monastery of Sant Pere de Rodes, offering breathtaking coastal views, and the celebrated Dali Museum in Figueres, created by the surrealist master. Whether exploring art, history, or simply the pleasures of the sea, Roses captures the spirit of the Mediterranean at its finest.

Day 7 St. Tropez (port), France

'Saint-Trop', is an iconic seaside resort renowned for its glamour, luxurious lifestyle, and rich historical heritage. This picturesque town, once a modest fishing village, has become a

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destination that attracts visitors from all over the world with its golden sandy beaches, picturesque alleyways, luxury boutiques and fashionable restaurants.

Day 8 Nice, France

Nice seduces with its enchanting mix of Mediterranean glamour and sun-drenched beaches. Stroll along the famous Promenade des Anglais, explore the historic charm of Vieux Nice with its colourful alleyways and bustling markets, and savour delicious cuisine. With its mild year-round climate, Nice offers the perfect escape where French elegance meets natural beauty.

Royal Clipper carries just 227 guests in luxurious style. The spacious decks include three inviting swimming pools. Find your very own world of privacy on one of the hidden balconies on either side of the bow, or go to even further lengths to get the best seat in the house. Passengers are invited to climb the mast (with safety harness provided) and take in the views from the converted crow's nest which not only offers the chance for a brief moment of reflection, but also provides the most unparalleled views of the lands and seas around you. If you thought the exterior areas were impressive, you will be even more amazed by Royal Clipper's interior spaces. Included in these is a three-deck atrium that enables sunlight to flood into the elegantly appointed, three-tiered dining room; featuring unreserved seating, meticulously prepared cuisine and an easy-going dress code which aims to make everyone feel included. And if your time isn't taken up by searching out distant lands from the crow's nest or enjoying a lovingly prepared meal in the dining room; you can always take a seat in the observation lounge, find solitude in the library or pamper yourself in the spa and health club, located in the unique Captain Nemo Lounge. Here you will even find underwater glass

portholes which mean that even the secrets of the deep are open to those who sail aboard. The legendary Preussen, the largest, fastest sailing ship the world had ever seen was launched in 1902. She ruled the seas for just eight years before she was involved in an accident in 1910. Royal Clipper was inspired by the Preussen and has the proud distinction of being the largest and only five-masted full-rigged sailing ship built since her predecessor was launched on her maiden voyage from Bremerhaven. With her complement of 42 sails, with a combined area of 56,000 square feet, Royal Clipper stands out amongst her peers in more ways than one. Heavier, longer and with the ability to carry more passengers than both Star Clipper and Star Flyer this extraordinary vessel cuts through the waves in majestic fashion and leaves all that sail in her awestruck. For all the characteristics that she possesses from the grand age of sail, Royal Clipper is as new and thoroughly modern, boasting a state-of-the-art navigation systems to prove it. She also combines beauty with comfort by offering onboard luxury. 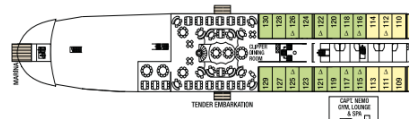

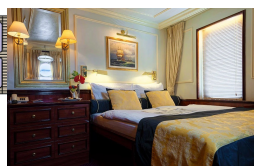
