



SICILY & GREECE 8 NIGHTS MEDITERRANEAN CRUISE

This autumn voyage links the classical heritage of Greece with the layered cultures of Sicily and Malta. From the philosophical legacy of Athens and the volcanic beauty of Milos to the Venetian elegance of Chania and the historic harbours of the Peloponnese, each stop reveals a distinct chapter of the Mediterranean story. Sailing west, the journey reaches the grand archaeological treasures of Syracuse, the rural calm of Gozo, and the fortified splendour of Valletta, blending myth, history, and coastal scenery under sail.



ITINERARY

Day 1 Piraeus (Port of Athens), Greece

Walking in the shadow of the Acropolis in the Agora, you can almost hear the voices of Plato, Socrates and Aristotle arguing about who was the greatest philosopher. Ancient Athens, the birthplace of democracy and epicenter of western civilization, is a city for all eternity. Piraeus is the port of Athens, just 15km from the city and 45km from the airport.

Day 2 Milos - Adamas, Greece

Milos, a gem of the Cyclades Islands, is famous for its striking volcanic landscape and colourful cliffs, as well as its more than



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70 unique beaches boasting crystal-clear waters. Adamas, the island's main port, is nestled in a sweeping natural bay. This bustling harbour town boasts inviting tavernas where visitors can sample local delicacies and enjoy the gentle hum of fishing boats bobbing on the turquoise water. Venture inland to discover Milos's hidden gems, such as Sarakiniko Bay's otherworldly landscape, Plaka's narrow streets and breathtaking views, and the vibrant fishermen's village of Klima with its distinctive 'symmata' houses. Adamas is a welcoming gateway and a serene retreat in the heart of the Cyclades.

[Day 3 Chania - Crete, Greece](#)

At the heart of Crete's western coast, Chania blends history and daily life with quiet charm. Its Venetian harbor, with the lighthouse at its edge, is a gathering place where the sea reflects the colors of old façades. Lose yourself in narrow alleys filled with the scent of jasmine, taste meze in a shaded courtyard, and watch the afternoon light soften the walls of ancient houses. Beyond the city, olive groves and rugged hills reveal Crete's natural beauty and proud traditions. Whether savouring local meze and wine by the water or simply soaking in the warm island atmosphere, Chania offers a truly unforgettable Cretan experience.

[Day 4 Gythio, Greece](#)

Located in the Peloponnese region of Greece, Gythio is a charming coastal town known for its beautiful beaches and vibrant harbor. It offers a mix of traditional Greek culture and modern amenities, with picturesque streets lined with

neoclassical buildings. Visitors can enjoy fresh seafood at waterfront tavernas and explore nearby ancient sites like the ruins of Sparta. The scenic views and relaxed atmosphere make it an ideal destination for a coastal getaway.

[Day 5 Pylos, Greece](#)

Homer's 'Wise King Nestor' was very wise indeed to build his magnificent palace near Pilos. For the city's harbour of Navarino Bay and the land-locked lake that was the original harbour were a perfect refuge from storms - and invaders. And it was at this site on October 20, 1827, with the help of Britain, Russia and France, that modern Greece attained independence, defeating the Turkish navy in the Battle of Navarino Bay.

Syracuse is a city on the Ionian coast of Sicily that's known for its ancient ruins. It was once the largest city in the world, bigger than Athens and Corinth and as you can imagine it's steeped in history. Visit Parco Archeologico della Neapolis, one of Sicily's greatest archaeological sites. Relax in one of its stylish little cafes that surround its beautiful baroque piazzas before wandering down its medieval lanes towards the sparkling blue sea.

Day 8 Gozo, Malta

The charm of Malta's sister island Gozo is immediately apparent. Steeped in myth Gozo is thought to be the legendary Calypso's isle of Homer's Odyssey. It's green, rural and calm, relying on fishing and agriculture as well as tourism. It is one of the Mediterranean's top diving destinations with an incredible range of shore and boat dives including reefs, caves and wrecks. There are also Knight's watchtowers, tiny chapels and beautiful peaceful beaches to explore.

Day 9 Valletta, Malta

Valletta is the tiny capital of the island of Malta. The walled city was established in the 1500s on a peninsula by the Knights of St. John, a Roman Catholic order. It has a rich historical past and is a European Art City and a World Heritage City. It has an abundance of museums, palaces and grand churches to visit but be sure not to miss out on exploring one of its beautiful gardens.

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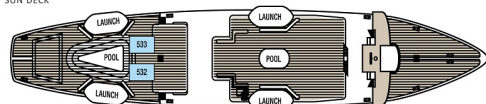
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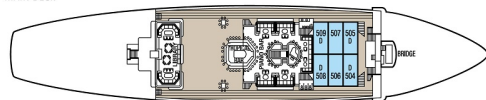

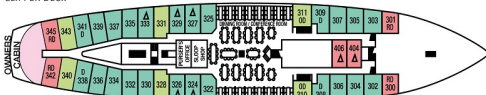
SUN DECK



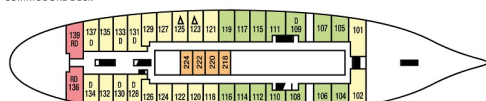
MAIN DECK
